PETC UK JUST A FEW STEPS AWAY

A Playwork Education and Training Council (PETC) is a forum where the playwork sector can discuss issues of strategic importance on all aspects of playwork education, training, and qualifications. PETCs are occupied by playwork employers, training providers, and representatives of relevant national organisations.

Over the last year, The Playwork Foundation and Play England have worked together to successfully re-establish PETC England. PETC Scotland is currently in the process of becoming established whilst PETC Wales and PETC Northern Ireland remain in operation.

To account for the different legislative and regulatory frameworks of each country, and to establish a more strategic UK-wide approach to playwork training and qualifications, it is hoped that it will soon be possible to convene a UK PETC a forum for the 4 national PETCs. This will not supersede the national PETCs but enhance opportunities to make playwork education. training, and qualifications more cohesive with a greater degree of transferability in the future.

LEVEL 2 PLAYWORK APPRENTICESHIP

The Playwork Apprenticeship Trailblazer Group, with the support of The Institute for Apprenticeships and Technical Education (IfATE), has been supporting the development of a Level 2 Playwork Apprenticeship in England.





TWO NEW PLAYWORK COURSES TO **SUPPORT HAF-FUNDED PROJECTS**

Since 2021, the UK Government has made funding available through the Holiday Activities and Food programme (HAF) to local authorities in England, to support children and young people in receipt of benefits-related free school meals (FSM) during the Easter, Summer, and Christmas school holidays.

The main aims of the funding are for children to:

- eat healthily
- be active
- take part in engaging and enriching
- be safe and not socially-isolated

The Playwork Foundation and Devon County Council have worked together to create two new training courses to support practitioners delivering the HAF programme to include playwork practice:

1 **PLAYTIME!** a single session introductory three hour course

2 LET'S TALK PLAY a five session, ten hour course

PlayTime! is endorsed by Play England and mapped against the Playwork National Occupational Standards at Level 2. Let's Talk Play is currently going through the endorsement process.

Endorsement requires a level of assessment to ensure learner knowledge - this will be achieved by learners completing an assessment paper for each session. Each learner will also receive a fullcolour, detailed coursebook to take home.

These courses are administered by Playwork Partnerships, part of the University of Gloucestershire.

LEVEL 2 PLAYWORK | NEW PLAYWORK **PEDAGOGY PDA**

Playwork providers in England and Northern Ireland can now access an up-to-date Level 2 Diploma for the Playwork Practitioner (ROF) thanks to the work of The Playwork Apprenticeship Trailblazer Group and Training Qualifications UK (TQUK).

DIPLOMA AVAILABLE

TOUK is recognised by both the Office of **Oualifications and Examination Regulation** (Ofgual) in England and the Council for the Curriculum, Examinations & Assessment (CCEA) in Northern Ireland.

The new qualification will support playworkers and others in a variety of out of school settings to deliver a range of playful opportunities. The qualification is available today at tquk.org.

A new Level 8, 80-credit Playwork Pedagogy Professional Development Award (PDA) is currently being developed in Scotland and will be at the same level as a second year of a degree.

WE BACKED THE BID FOR WRECSAM TO BECOME A UK CAPITAL OF PLAY

In 2022, we reported how The Playwork Foundation supported a virtual event convened by The Venture entitled 'Cyfoeth o Chwarae Wrecsam Capital of Play' opened by the Prime Minister of Wales, Mark Drakeford MS.

The online conference was in aid of the town's bid to become City of Culture 2025 - a UK-wide competition run by the UK Government's Department of Digital, Culture, Media & Sport (DCMS) - which had "play" as one of 7 main pillars of the bid. Shortly after the 2022 Eastbourne conference, we received the news that Wrecsam had been shortlisted to the final 4!

Later, in May 2022, to coincide with a judges visit, Wrexham Council, The Venture, Assemble Play, and a host of local artists (including graffiti artists and poets) collaborated to create a 3-day event entitled "Word Play". Held across a pedestrianised part of the town centre and a newly-reclaimed derelict site turned into an urban green space, the event aimed to demonstrate how art and play as living culture can bring communities together. Making the town centre explicitly child-friendly (albeit for a few days) also encouraged more people to visit which supported the local economy.

Although Wrecsam was ultimately pipped to the post by Bradford, preparations for the competition created a momentum and spirit of community that has continued, and work is already underway to bid for City of Culture 2029.
